Frazier Water Protocol patient satisfaction rate at 95 percent

Caroline Salva Romero, MA, CCC-SLP, and Becky Green-Dixon, MS, CCC-SLP, coauthored a presentation on "Frazier Water Protocol in the Rehab Setting" at the recent American Speech Language Hearing Association National Convention.

From the presentation: "The application of water programs with dysphagic patients has come to the forefront in dysphagia treatment with various pros and cons presented.

"But the ultimate question that must be answered is – what is best for our patients? After reviewing the literature and data provided to us regarding water programs, our

facility decided that instituting a specific water protocol could not only meet the needs of our patients safely, but also improve their overall satisfaction with our diet recommendations and therapy services."

The presentation outlined the specific program used in our facility and its overall success in keeping our patients safe and satisfied.

Since its beginning in November 2007, 45 dysphagia patients have participated in the Frazier Water Protocol program.

There have been no incidents of pneumonia or UTIs. Percentage of dehydration requiring IV intervention is at 4 percent, which had been an

ongoing issue prior to admission at rehab. The satisfaction rate is at 95 percent.

Program Inclusion

- Dysphagia evaluation completed
- Thorough oral assessment
- Specific SLP order for Frazier Water Protocol
- Patient either NPO or taking a thickened liquid

Program Exclusion

- Medical fragility
- Poor oral care
- Excessive/violent coughing with water

Optometric Vision Rehab available at HealthSouth

Since 2005, Dr. Tracy Sepich, Optometrist, has been providing specialized eye care services here at HealthSouth Nittany Valley. Dr. Sepich provides bedside in-patient eye examinations to diagnose ocular disease and vision disabilities and to direct therapy. Diagnoses commonly made at HealthSouth include visual field loss, double vision, visual neglect, as well as diabetic retinopathy, dry eyes, and conjunctivitis.



Treatments ordered by Dr. Sepich may include occupational, physical or speech therapy, or medical intervention such as eye drops or consultation with appropriate specialists. Dr. Sepich does not require a physician referral and can evaluate a patient at the request of the patient, family, or other healthcare providers. Dr. Sepich generally comes to HealthSouth Nittany Valley on Thursday afternoons.

Dr. Sepich completed both a Doctor of Optometry degree and a Master of Science degree in Low Vision Rehabilitation from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1991. She is also a graduate of Penn State University and State College Area High School. Dr. Sepich lives in State College with her husband and four children.
